He began his ministry by declaring, "The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news" (Mark 1:15). Jesus spoke many kingdom parables. The very heart of the words messiah and Christ is that Jesus is the King of his spiritual nation. Of Christians Peter wrote, "You are a chosen people ... a holy nation (1 Peter 2:9). Whenever and wherever people surrender to the rule of God, there will be the kingdom of God, the church of God.

But note. Many of us have deep feelings of patriotism towards America. We love the USA, and we give our time, energy and money to participate in patriotic events and organizations. All this is good. It has its place. But Scripture Reading: how much better it is to love the Lord's kingdom and sacrifice your time. Gary energy and money for it.

As great as America is, it will not last forever. It may be overpowered Hymn: someday by a more powerful nation. Our economy may someday crumble and fall. The examples of the great Roman and Alexandrian empires vividly demonstrate this possibility. But the Lord's kingdom will never be destroyed (Daniel 2:44). Even Satan with his demonic forces cannot destroy the kingdom of God (Matthew 16:18).

Do you feel as patriotic towards the church as you do America? Do you have feelings of pride, loyalty and devotion for the church? Are you willing to sacrifice for the Lord's kingdom with your time, energy and resources? If so, show it! Don't hide your light under a bushel. Don't limit your Christian activities to within the walls of a church building. Let everybody know you are a citizen of the Kingdom of God!
