## To Love a Cause Greater Than Self

Yesterday, our nation and other nations, honored those Veterans who have served our armed forces to provide us the freedom we now enjoy. It is a time as well when we pay tribute to those family members who stood by them. We thank God for such courageous and unselfish people.

This holiday, Veterans Day, was initially recognized to honor those who served in the First World War which ended at 11 AM on the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918.
