Where you die, I will die, and there will I be buried. The LORD do so to me, and more also, If anything but death parts you and me." (Ruth 1:16-17)

What a beautiful pledge of love and loyalty! If you are married, may I encourage you to do something today you may not have done in quite a while -- give thanks to God for your inlaws.
